The College is delighted to be able to congratulate the Form 5 Class of 2019 on truly impressive IGCSE results. There were 83 students who sat the examinations of which 92.8% achieved 5 or more A* - C grades. 35% of the students achieved 5 or more A or A* grades which really is quite remarkable. Our top student scored 6 A*s and 3 As. Mr Lowry, Principal of the College, commented proudly on the very high standard achieved by the students in the class of 2019 and attributed their success to their own hard work, the support of their parents and guardians and the efforts of their teachers who work tirelessly to make results like these possible.
