At the heart of the UWC Mission is the concept of Peace. **Peace** — not as a lofty ideal, but as an intentional daily practice. As a UWC school, we are bound by a shared commitment "to make education a force to unite people, nations, and cultures for **peace** and a sustainable future". 3 students from lower school 3 students from form 4 12 students from form five 13 students from IB1 14 students from IB2


